

ACT!

Let's play CRUNCH, POP, FREEZE!
Milk and Juice went through lots of transformations—we can too!

Materials: Your imagination!



- 1. Gather children into a circle and ask them to think of a favorite toy that has plastic. There's a good chance this plastic was recycled.
- 2. Choose a few children to go to the center of the group.
- 3. Suggest a container to act out: milk, juice, fruit carton, etc. They can create container's shapes with their arms and legs.
- 4. Call out, "CRUNCH!" Everybody drops to the ground and gets crunched and recycled.
- 5. Call out, "POP!" Everybody pops back up acting out their previously chosen toy.
- 6. Call out, "FREEZE!" Everybody freezes (so it doesn't get too crazy) until you release them to their seats and invite the next set of children to the center of the group.

Optional: Have children guess each other's toys.

DRAW!

After playing Crunch, Pop, freeze! children can use the three panel comic template on the following page to draw their transformations or think up new ones!

Materials: Print outs of comic template

Pencils

Colored pencils, crayons, or markers

WHAT SHOULD I DRAW (and write)?

first Panel: Draw a plastic character.

Second Panel: Write "CRUNCH!" or your own onomatopoeia. Everyone could generate a list to choose from together- sound words are fun!


Third Panel: Draw your newly recycled character!

Encourage kids to use as much color as they want and make up a little story!



WHO WILL I BE?...YOU GET TO DECIDE!

- 1. Draw your container character.
- 2. Write CRUNCH, or another fun sound word.
- 3. Draw who they become after they are recycled!

Have children write recycling adventure stories of their own!

Use the guide on the following page to organize your story ideas. Then write a longer, more detailed story using it for reference.

To make stories feel extra special, mount them on colorful paper or leave room for a border children can decorate. If there are multiple pages, have kids make a fun cover, then do a simple hole punch and yarn binding (make sure there's room on the left for the holes!).

For extra fun, kids could write stories about their characters from the "MAKE A NEW FRIEND" activity.

If you have room, display stories alongside their creations for everybody to enjoy. Another option is to photograph children's creations and attach them to their stories for presentation on a wall.

For even MORE extra fun, children could research and write little reports or include different facts about the countries their characters travel to. You could pin their locations on a world map for everyone to see!
